Bowler Accomplishments

So far this season we have processed 7,410 awards. 15 people bowled their first 300 games and 6 people bowled their first 800 series. A total of 56-300's and 19-800 series bowled so far this season, nicely done bowlers!

It is important that secretaries report all honor scores whether it is the 2nd, 5th or even 100th time a bowler bowls an honor score. The bowler's permanent record is documented with the date of the accomplishment. The bowlers

records are used when determining eligibility for several things to include induction into the Hall of Fame.

Meritorious Service is the category for the bowlers who give all they can to promote the sport and the Greater Portland USBC Association. These people go above and beyond to donate their time. money and knowledge. They are a rare breed as they remain behind the spotlight and make things happen. Without these people things would not happen. They organize, coach, encourage and support others.

Meritorious Service nominees are voted on by the voting members, but the final selection is made by the Board of Directors.

The ballots for this year's nominees have been mailed out and are due back NLT March 15, 2020.

We hope all voting members remember what an honor it was to be nominated and take a few minutes to vote and return the ballots in a timely manner. You can vote for as many nominees you feel deserve to be inducted.

2019-2020 Greater Portland Championship Tournaments

Are you ready for a fun time? This year the Greater Portland Open Championship Tournament and the Greater Portland Women's Championship Tournament will be held simultaneously at Milwaukie Bowl on April 4-5, 11-12, and 18-19.

These two tournaments remain separate but will be held and managed at the same location and same time. We feel this will be advantageous to the bowling center hosting the tournaments as well as the board members managing the tour-

naments.

Rest assured that both tournaments will retain their characteristics that we have worked so hard to design. In other words, we will still have the special surprises we have always had for the Women's Tournament and hope to add a little excitement to the Open Tournament.

We are planning on running Brackets but will have them broke down by average or division. Tournament prize funds will remain separate. We have added squads to help with ease of

scheduling. You can bowl multiple events provided they are on separate squads. Teams must have at least one different bowler each entry, as well as doubles must be with a new partner each entry.
